§974. Right of owner to search for lost logs

The owner of logs, masts or spars referred to in section 971 or the owner's agent may at any time enter in a peaceable manner upon any mill, mill-brow, boom or raft of logs or other timber in search of that lost property. Whoever willfully prevents or obstructs a search for that lost property forfeits for each offense not less than \$20 nor more than \$50, to the person by whom or on whose account the entry was claimed, to be recovered in a civil action.
