Officer Drown had a 45-year career in public safety, which began in 1974, when he joined the Gorham Fire Department as a volunteer firefighter. He worked his way up to captain in the department. In 1982, he became a reserve police officer for the Gorham Police Department, becoming a full-time officer in 1984. He was promoted to police detective in 1986 and became Gorham High School's full-time school resource officer in 1998. He was involved in the Maine Special Olympics, including the very first Special Olympics in the State, and participated in the Maine Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics since it began in 1984. He refereed local basketball games and coached golf and softball at the high school. He received several awards, especially for his achievements in community policing. In January, the Maine Association of Police gave him its Larry Gross Cop's Cop Award, recognizing his commitment to the well-being of his fellow officers, both on and off duty, as well as his work ethic.
